

**TELECOMMUNICATIONS ACT 2000**  
**ADMINISTRATIVE NOTICE NUMBER 1**

**Short Range Device (“SRD”) used for Local Area Network (“LAN”)**

This Notice is issued by the Minister for Communications under Section 10(1) of the Telecommunications Act 2000 (“the Act”) to clarify the criteria which the Minister and the Gibraltar Regulatory Authority will adopt to exercise their functions under the Act or regulations made under it.

SRD(LAN) are licensed under Part IV of the Act and are referred to in the Telecommunications (Part IV) Regulations 2001. There is a requirement to define the terms “SRD(LAN)”, “point-to-point link”, “point-to-multipoint link” and the fees payable for each of these links.

**SRD(LAN)**

Short range devices which operate at 2400 – 2483.5MHz and have an external antenna fitted for the purpose of connecting two or more remote sites/buildings and *radiating* a maximum of 100mW eirp.

**Point-to-point**

An established SRD(LAN) link between two fixed points for the sole purpose of connecting two remote sites together, albeit via a fixed relay point.

**Point-to-multipoint**

Used to link up various distinct users via an SRD(LAN), which may be creating a public network. Please note that an additional Authorisation is required to provide a service to the public.

**Fees**

These fees are subject to an increase of 4% effective on 19<sup>th</sup> July each year.
