

## FREQUENCIES FOR THE AMATEUR AND AMATEUR SATELLITE SERVICES

1. The frequency bands or sub-bands listed below have been agreed by the Gibraltar Regulatory Authority on behalf of the Government of Gibraltar, for use by the amateur service within Gibraltar. Those annotated with an asterisk may additionally be used by the amateur-satellite service.

4. Additional bands or sub-bands allocated to the amateur service:

GHz 76-81 119.98-120.02 144-149 241-248	In these bands the amateur service has a secondary allocation in the International Table of Frequency Allocations. Within Gibraltar, until the national primary allocations have been decided, frequencies are assigned on a case by case basis and are subject to withdrawal without notice.

5. The bands allocated to the amateur service at 3 500 kHz, 7 000 kHz, 10 100 kHz, 18 068 kHz, 21 000 kHz and 144 MHz may, in the event of natural disasters, be used by non-amateur stations to meet the need of international communications in the disaster area. RR 5.120 refers.

6. The band allocated to the amateur service at 50-51 MHz may, in the event of natural disasters, be used by non-amateur stations to meet the need of communications in the disaster area.
